
RE: Warning Notice: [REDACTED] Radio Frequency Interference; Case # EB-07-SE-2954

Dear Mr. Brown:

On August 6, 2007 we notified Rayle that the Commission had received complaints from [REDACTED] [REDACTED], [REDACTED] GA 30627, of harmful radio interference from power line hardware owned by Rayle. One source of the noise was apparently identified as a pole bearing the identification "S.W.P.I. 1989" located on Lexington-Carlton Road near the intersection of Eades Road.

The August 6, 2007 letter advised that the interference, if unresolved, could be a violation of FCC rules and could result in a monetary forfeiture. For this reason, we encouraged the parties involved to voluntarily resolve this matter without FCC intervention. The letter stated, however, that if it became necessary for the FCC to facilitate a resolution, the FCC might investigate possible rules violations and address appropriate remedies, including monetary forfeiture. Rayle did not reply to our letter, as it was requested to, in order to avoid enforcement action.

Mr. Sorrow reports that there has been no significant decrease in the radio frequency interference. In order to avoid enforcement action in this matter, you are requested to advise this office within 30 days of receipt of this letter as to what actions you have taken in order to identify and eliminate the sources of Mr. [REDACTED] radio interference.
